Mary, being a pure vessel, born into a world much like our modern one with its natural joys and malefactions, proceeds like a radiant dawn bringing forth a new light for our hearts. She did this with her "fiat" when she agreed to bring forth the Savior into the world, and she will do it again when it is time to enter the "New Jerusalem."

The setting of this text is intended to place both singer and listener as a witness to that *great sign* that "appeared in heaven: A woman clothed with the sun, and the moon under her feet, and on her head a crown of twelve stars."
